Spiritual direction is about companionship. In a Christian context, a spiritual director is someone who accompanies you as you explore your spirituality and grow in relationship with God. Spiritual direction can help you listen for the voice of God and live more fully into Christian faith. A spiritual director will invite you to reflect on your life in the light of faith, guide you in prayer and spiritual practices, listen to and with you in discerning God's purposes for you, and encourage your baptismal discipleship.

For the 2016-17 academic year, the General Theological Seminary is blessed by the ministry of three spiritual directors who offer one-on-one conversations with students, staff, faculty, family members, and residents at the Seminary:



### **Barbara Cawthorne Crafton**

is an Episcopal priest, spiritual director, author, and adjunct professor for the Center for Christian Spirituality. ### **Making an Appointment**

You may choose to meet with a spiritual director once or twice during the year, or to establish an ongoing relationship by meeting once a month throughout the year.
